SRP Mandates under SARA

University-based basic research program established in 1986 under the Superfund Amendments Reauthorization Act (SARA)

HEALTH EFFECTS

Development of: Advanced techniques for the detection, assessment, and evaluation of the human health effects of hazardous

substances

ASSESSING RISK

Development of: Methods to assess the risks to human health presented

hazardous substances by

DETECTION

Development of: Methods and technologies to detect hazardous

substances in the environment

REMEDIATION

Development of: Basic biological, chemical, and physical methods to reduce the amount and toxicity of hazardous

substances

SRP Stakeholders
